From Our Founder

Dear HALO Family,

I am sharing a story with you that tells the story of this report in a way that numbers cannot. It was written by a HALO Alum that was a foster child who bounced around from home to home and dealt with unbelievable neglect and obstacles.

“What HALO Means to Me” by Eternity



Growing up, it was hard feeling like I wasn't loved or cared about. Feeling like I didn't have anyone, or feeling like I had to do things on my own as a child. I then began to search for a mentor - someone who could help me guide myself in the right direction. When I found her, she began to show me that there are people out here that could help me. I went through some major hardships throughout my life as I grew into a young woman and adult, but then I was blessed to find out I was going to be a mom. I knew it was as they say, "Go Time". My mentor introduced me to HALO, and going into it I was nervous, especially about being alone or feeling alone, but HALO was the opposite of what I was thinking. They were a blended family I never thought I'd find. When I moved into HALO, I was 4 months pregnant with no clue of how I was going to do this but they truly helped me and was there every step of the way. And by the time I had Izaiah, I was sooo prepared for this journey of motherhood. All of the love Izaiah and I received was just so amazing, it helped me become who I am today. I lived at HALO twice before aging out, and I really feel they helped me get on my feet and have a vision of what I want to do with my life. And even after moving out, they are still here for us, Izaiah is now 4 years old, and HALO is just as loving and caring as it was when we first met them. You all saved me and my son and I just want to say thank you. I am forever grateful for everything you all have done for us. And that's appreciation to every staff member HALO has had. You all have impacted my life so much, and it turned into a forever family. Thank you.

This story puts a face to the numbers you will read in our Annual Report. I am proud of what we have done together for kids like Eternity and her son Izaiah. We are beyond excited for what we will be able to accomplish in the years to come.

Our Work

6,000

In Kansas City, Mo., Point In Time* estimates that there are nearly 6,000 homeless 13-24 year olds in need in Kansas City. This DOES NOT include teens who are living on couches and in compromising circumstances, as we so oftentimes hear from youth in need of HALO housing.

Point In Time provides the official homelessness count and numbers from local school districts.

Babies born in Missouri with an opioid addiction has increased by 538% over the last 10 years. This cripples the hospitals, foster system, and affects older children who are in the system. There just aren't enough places for these kids to go.

Through partnerships with Jefferson City Public Schools, HALO identified over 140 high school students living in homeless or dangerous situations, who were in need of housing, in Jefferson City. This number is likely underreported, as counts such as the Point in Time Count, rely on self reporting of homelessness, which the general age population of HALO youth may not feel comfortable reporting.

Point In Time provides the official homelessness count and numbers from local school districts.

Our Work



HOUSING

Shelter from the storm, in more ways than one. Providing the foundation of a family means we not only give homeless kids a safe place to sleep, we teach them how to make their bed every morning.

That's just one of hundreds of little how-tos most kids learn from their parents or grandparents. HALO kids learn them here in order to take on a wide spectrum of needs, from simply surviving the night, to surviving their first job interview, to thriving on their own as successful young adults.



HEALING

Homelessness hurts. Art heals. A picture is worth a thousand words, and our kids have plenty of stories to tell. But often, they don't want to talk about their life before HALO. Therapeutic art provides kids with a safe place to purge painful memories and share their stories, so they can start the healing process without having to say a word.

Living on the fringes can leave lasting scars, inside and out. So beyond the breakthroughs brought about through works of art, HALO supports healing holistically, through counseling sessions, medical check-ups, life skill courses, and a program called iEmpathize, which teaches kids how to recognize and avoid negative relationships, sex trafficking, and predators.

A little love goes a long way in helping kids come back from the edges of their community, so they can someday play a role in shaping it.



EDUCATION

After years on the street, kids are hungry for much more than food. HALO puts homeless kids on a path to a positive future. Through tutoring, professional development, scholarships and help preparing for higher education, our kids work hard to leave the "at-risk" label behind and finally be seen as just a great kid with the potential to do great things.

Our Work



Transitional Living Program

The HALO Transitional Living Program (TLP) is an 18 month-long program that provides free housing for pregnant, parenting, and non-parenting youth ages 16-21 years old who are in homeless or high-risk situations. The goal of the HALO TLP is to help youth exit “crisis mode,” set long-term goals for themselves, and learn to live independently.

This program provides children of parenting teens a safe and stable living environment and assistance in securing daycare. Youth who are accepted into the program are required to be enrolled in school and seek and obtain part-time employment while they are in school. Youth who have graduated from high school must either obtain full-time employment or start college classes.

Youth are required to participate in life-skills workshops, which are aimed at teaching them how to live independently. Parenting youth are required to take weekly parenting classes. HALO staff work with youth on 5 main focus areas: Daily Living, Self Care, Relationships and Communication, Housing and Money Management, and Career and Education. Each youth meets weekly with HALO Staff to work on their goals and assess their progress throughout the program.

Learning Center

Through therapeutic art programs, tutoring, professional development, scholarships and help preparing for higher education, our kids work hard to leave the “at-risk” label behind and finally be seen as a great kid with the potential to do great things. Programs are offered year round, multiple times a week, with a future focused curriculum to equip our youth with life skills to promote healing and help them to learn independently in a safe environment.

HALO delivers free programming and services to awarded program recipients on an annual basis to help provide the full circle of care for youth in the greatest need.

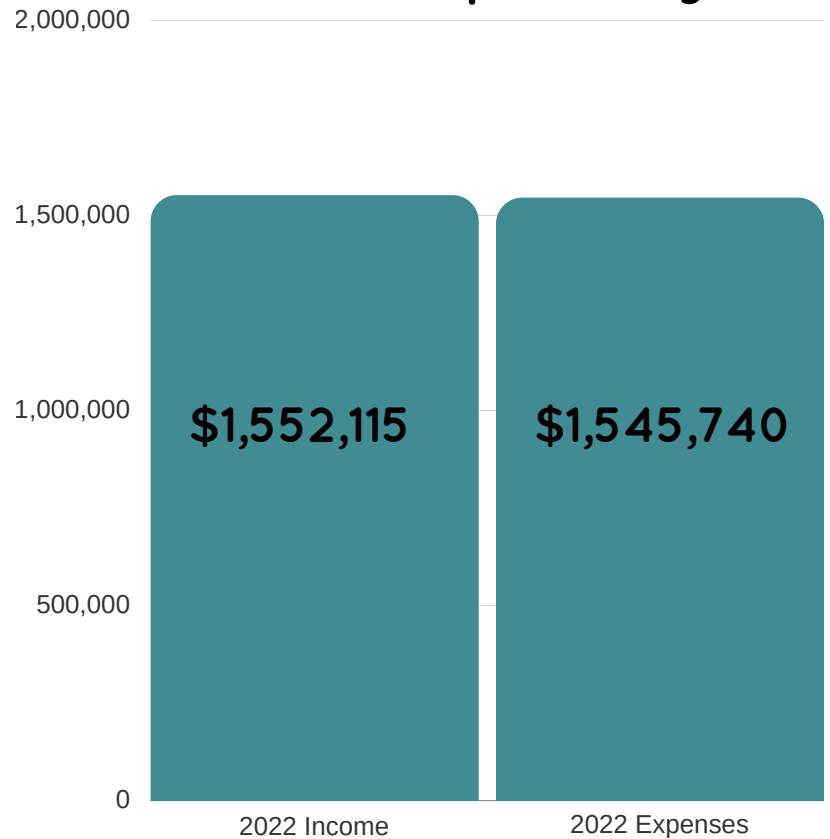

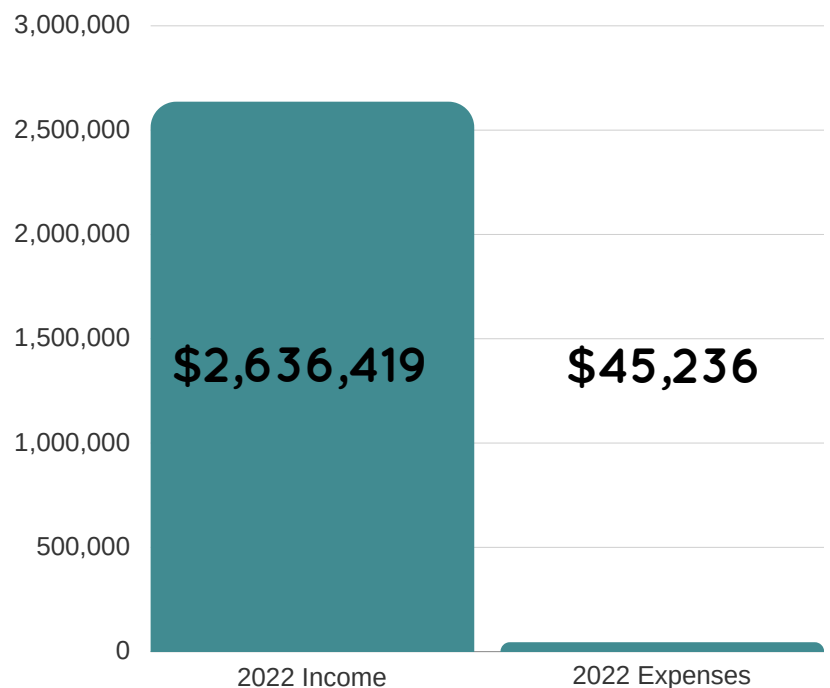

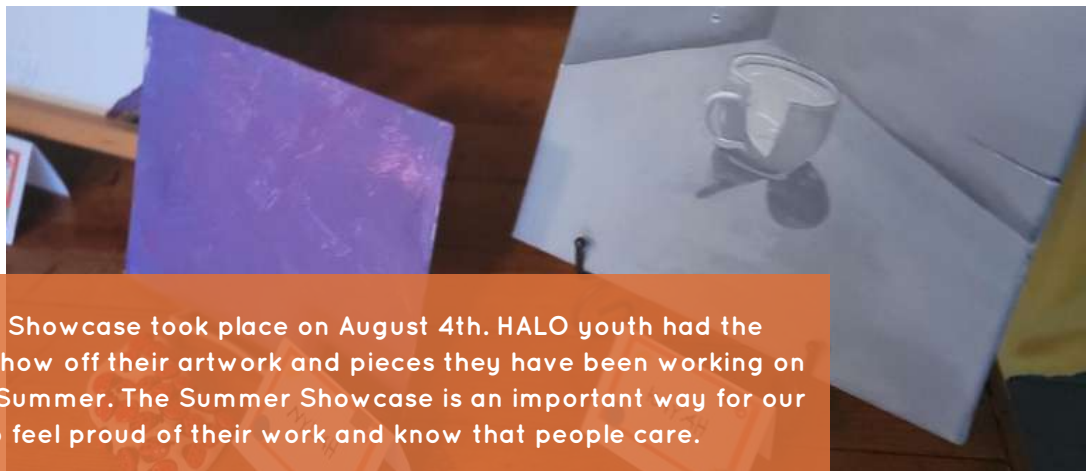


On Thursday, September 15th, we hosted the 4th Annual "I Defy the Odds" Inspiration Breakfast at The Abbott.
