Dear HALO Family,

In 2005, HALO started with a spark. At the time, I was a young woman in my 20's who just returned to the U.S. from a mission trip in Honduras. I had worked with a group of kids living on the street who were tiny, hungry, and in need of a home. They were still just children, wanting safety, love, and the freedom to play. When I returned to the U.S., their faces never left my mind. I told everyone I could about them and about the thousands of other children like them who had no one to turn to. I was desperate to do something but didn't know where to start and because the problem was so overwhelming and I was so young, people had trouble taking me seriously.

A few months later, I was teaching a martial arts class to a group of kids in Kansas City and told them stories of children, their same age, who had no home. I told them that the children slept on cardboard boxes outside at night, that they begged people for water, they had one shirt and shorts and no shoes, and they dreamt of going to school. The martial arts students couldn't believe that there were other kids out there who lived like this when they had parents to tuck them in at night. They asked question after question about why this was allowed to happen. One of the kids asked, "Well, why don't we do something about it?" Another kid joined in, "Yeah, why don't we help them?"

I often think about how HALO began - with a group of children who believed so strongly in themselves and in humanity, they never hesitated to take action. They never doubted themselves or thought that they wouldn't reach their giant goals. This group of kids ended up raising over \$250,000 for kids in need which literally changed thousands of lives and triggered something so great that it is still impacting over 3,000 kids every year. They sparked thousands of volunteers and donors to do something for homeless children in desperate need. HALO grew organically, with meetings at homes, libraries, and restaurants, with people who used their skill set to truly make an impact. We modeled the belief of the children who started HALO and had no fear in asking people to help because the cause was so urgent.

Now, 18 years later, we have built this gigantic family that continues to grow. It is a family of volunteers, supporters, staff, and the kids we serve. Our kids grow up and come back for Thanksgiving dinners and birthdays as young adults. When they have a tire blow out, they always have someone to call because of our HALO Family, each of you, who pick up the phone when we call. Watching our HALO children grow and build a life of dignity for themselves and their families has been one of the greatest honors of my life. We are so grateful that you are part of it all, that our HALO family has done this together.

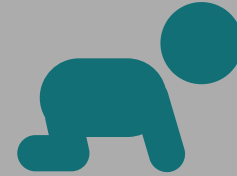

In Kansas City, Mo., Point In Time* estimates that there are nearly 6,000 homeless 13-24 year olds in need in Kansas City. This DOES NOT include teens who are living on couches and in compromising circumstances, as we so oftentimes hear from youth in need of HALO housing.

Through partnerships with Jefferson City Public Schools, HALO identified over 140 high school students in Jefferson City living in homelessness or unsafe conditions. This number is likely underreported, as counts like the Point in Time Count rely on self-reporting, which many HALO youth may avoid.

OUR WORK



HOUSING

Shelter from the storm, in more ways than one.

Providing the foundation of a family means we not only give homeless kids a safe place to sleep, we teach them how to make their bed every morning.

That's just one of hundreds of little how-tos most kids learn from their parents or grandparents. HALO kids learn them here in order to take on a wide spectrum of needs, from simply surviving the night, to surviving their first job interview, to thriving on their own as successful young adults.



HEALING

Homelessness hurts. Art heals.

A picture is worth a thousand words, and our kids have plenty of stories to tell. But often, they don't want to talk about their life before HALO. Therapeutic art provides kids with a safe place to purge painful memories and share their stories, so they can start the healing process without having to say a word.

Living on the fringes can leave lasting scars, inside and out. So beyond the breakthroughs brought about through works of art, HALO supports healing holistically, through counseling sessions, medical check-ups, life skill courses, and a program called iEmpathize, which teaches kids how to recognize and avoid negative relationships, sex trafficking, and predators. A little love goes a long way in helping kids come back from the edges of their community, so they can someday play a role in shaping it.



EDUCATION

After years on the street, kids are hungry for much more than food.

HALO puts homeless kids on a path to a positive future. Through tutoring, professional development, scholarships and help preparing for higher education, our kids work hard to leave the "at-risk" label behind and finally be seen as just a great kid with the potential to do great things.



OUR WORK

Transitional Living Program

The HALO Transitional Living Program (TLP) is an 18-24 month program that provides free housing for pregnant, parenting, and non-parenting youth ages 16-21 years old who are in homeless or high-risk situations. The goal of the HALO TLP is to help youth exit “crisis mode,” set long-term goals for themselves, and learn to live independently.

This program provides children of parenting teens a safe and stable living environment and assistance in securing daycare. Youth who are accepted into the program are required to be enrolled in school and seek and obtain part-time employment while they are in school. Youth who have graduated from high school must either obtain full-time employment or start college classes.

Youth are required to participate in life-skills workshops, which are aimed at teaching them how to live independently. Parenting youth are required to take weekly parenting classes. HALO staff work with youth on 5 main focus areas: Daily Living, Self Care, Relationships and Communication, Housing and Money Management, and Career and Education. Each youth meets weekly with HALO staff to work on their goals and assess their progress throughout the program.

OUR WORK **Learning Centers**

Through therapeutic art programs, tutoring, professional development, scholarships and help preparing for higher education, our kids work hard to leave the “at-risk” label behind and finally be seen as a great kid with the potential to do great things. Programs are offered year round, multiple times a week, with a future focused curriculum to equip our youth with life skills to promote healing and help them to learn independently in a safe environment.

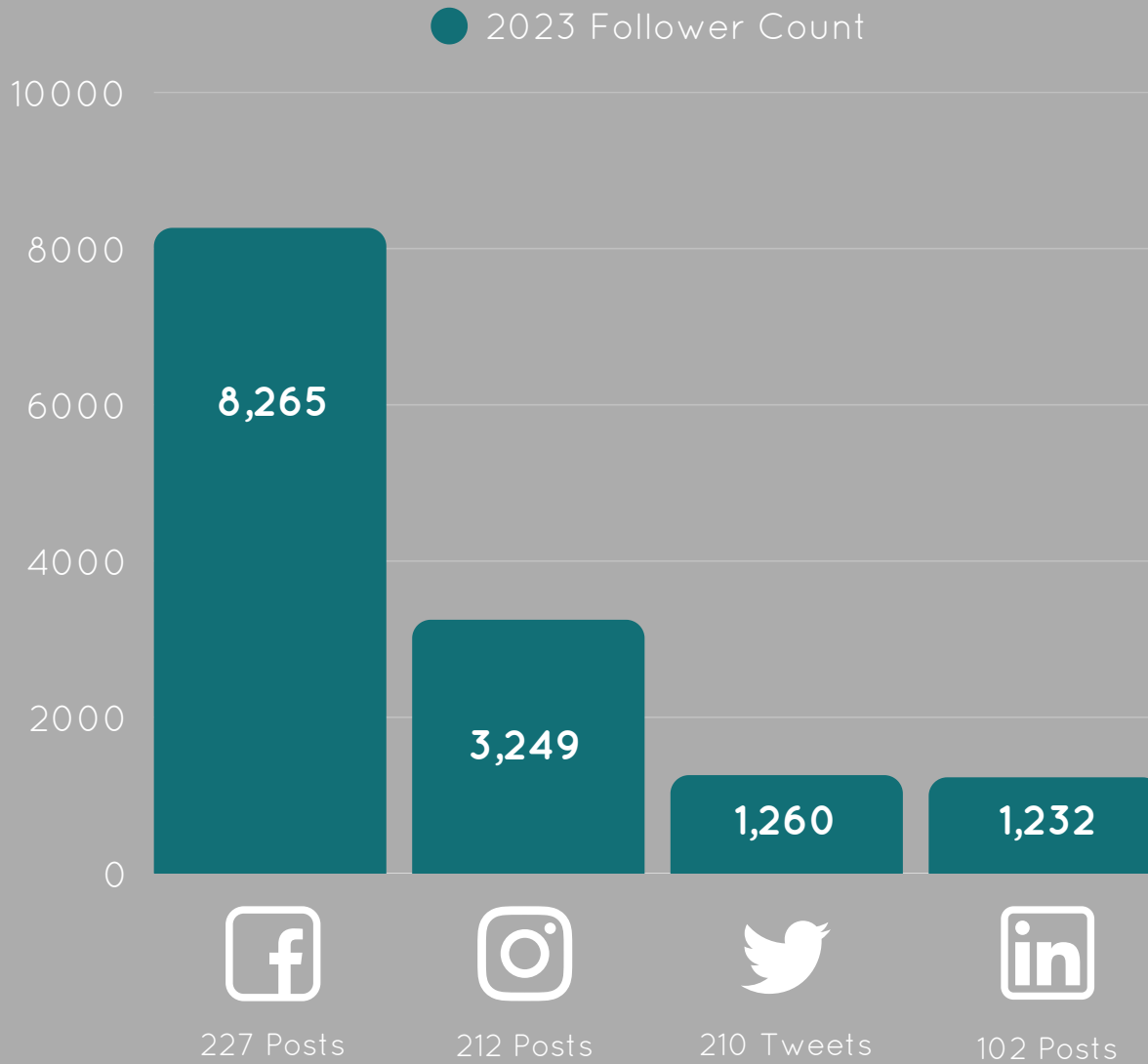


Capital Campaign
